
the VCCA keep our citizens informed about neighborhood happenings.

Recycling in the VCCA

Our green curbside recyclables containers have become a permanent fixture every other week on trash day. Did you also know that yard trimmings collection service is offered to all citizens who receive the automated garbage collection service? Just follow these simple steps:

- Place yard waste in city-approved compostable bags. Look for the City Approved logo on boxes of Compostable bags. They can likely be purchased at places like HEB, Randall's, and Kroger's.
- Small branches, weeds, grass clippings*, and leaves should be placed in compostable bags.
- ♦ The compostable bags should be placed at the curb 3 feet away from the automated containers.
- The compostable bags should not be placed in the automated containers.
- The bags should weigh less than 50 pounds.
- Small branches may be put in bundles as long as each bundle is less than 4 feet in length, 18 inches in diameter, and weighing less than 50 pounds.
- Yard trimmings mixed with paper, plastic or any other type of waste will not be collected.

Did you know that grass clippings can also be left on your lawn to return valuable nutrients to your soil. Composting yard trimmings is also an option.

By taking the time to bag up your yard waste, you are reducing the approximately 30% of the total residential waste stream in Houston. Thank you for being part of this great community we call home. For more information, please go to: http://www.houstontx.gov/solidwaste/
