For the first time since they began monitoring their crime statistics about a year ago, <u>our neighbors in Winlow Place had ZERO reported crimes of any kind in November</u> (the second month of their contract), and their Patrol logged 1,367 miles in Winlow and Mandel Place.



Helping Stray Cats: VCCA TNR Volunteers

We continue to see progress in our VCCA Trap and Release (TNR) Program - all because of your sup-

A touching example of our amazing neighborhood working together to make this happen is seen on our very own Hazard Street. A neighbor has been working to trap a mama cat and her growing kittens. Over the course of several months, he was

able to trap the mother and all four of her offspring along with one adult male cat, who may have been the father. He shuttled them back and forth to SNAP and another neighbor took care of the cats while they recovered from the spay/neuter procedures. The mama cat had a small wound on her neck that was also treated by SNAP. Her If you have any questions, appetite is better and all the cats are doing well. A friend took two of the cats in, and the rest were released back to where they were found. They all continue to be given food and water by the compassionate neighbor.

Help is Available: If you have unaltered cats/kittens around your house or a neighbor's house, they need to be spayed/neutered. You can identify a cat/kitten that has already been spayed/neutered by looking at its ears. A spayed/neutered cat will have the

tip of its left ear clipped off. If you need assistance getting neighborhood cats fixed, we can help and it's


