### **Blue and White Tile Committee**

ave you ever noticed the blue and white mosaic tiles on the curbs in our neighborhood indicating street names? These markers were placed on our curbs as early as the 1920s up to the 1950s as a way for a citizens to orient themselves during a less fast



-paced era. As a young city at that time, these blue tile street signs were the original street markers of the first paved streets of Houston. The growing popularity of the automobile brought an end to this naming practice. Drivers were going faster and found that street signs on poles were easier to read as they cruised by.

Although Houston has grown to be the fourth largest city in the United States with rapid population growth and abundant new construction, many of the blue tile street signs have miraculously survived. Many of these beautiful pieces of artwork and craftsmanship are still found in Houston's older neighborhoods, but they are slowly disappearing due to deteriorating curbs, vehicle damage, new curbing, and new construction.

Are you interested in protecting the Blue and White street name tiles that are on the curbs in VCCA? A
