NATIONAL NIGHT OUT PARADE







OCTOBER 6TH AT 6:15 PM

There will not be a traditional VCCA National Night Out due to COVID-19, but...there will be a parade through the neighborhood! This will include the Harris County Constables, the Houston Police Department, and cars decorated and driven by VCCA Officers—followed by an ice cream truck, and a cocktail truck!

The parade will leave Fairview at 6:15 pm and proceed according to the route listed below. Use the route to determine the approximate time the parade will be on your street. You will also be able to tell by the flashing lights from the Constables and Houston Police cars, and maybe an occasional siren.

Residents are asked to make posters for a sign contest, the details of which can be found on page 2. If you do not want to make a sign, just wave and clap. We look forward to seeing all of you in front of your homes. Be sure to enjoy a cocktail and/or ice-cream while having a (safe and social-distanced) great time!

COCKTAIL TRUCK INFORMATION

Those over 21 will be able to grab a cocktail from - Beginning at Fairview and Huldy, turn right on Huldy Bovine and Barley. While they will drive down each street and stop for orders, they also request that preorders be texted to 713-204-6921.

Pre-ordering is the best way to insure they will stop at your house! Pre-orders will be given a pick-up time window. Please only show up during your given time - Take Brun to Haddon and turn right. frame. Include your name, address, and order in the - Take Haddon to McDuffie and turn left. text message. Please specify single or double or type of beer (Dos XX or Modelo) when ordering.

NOTE: All orders must include food per TABC. However, the truck offers affordable food options: Chips \$1 or Chips & salsa \$6.

- Take McDuffie to Peden and turn right.
- Take Peden to Driscoll and turn right.
- Take Driscoll to Vermont and turn right.
- Take Vermont to Huldy and turn left.
- Take Huldy to Welch and turn left.
- Take Welch to Driscoll and turn right.
- Take Driscoll to Indiana and turn right.
- Take Huldy to Fairview, back to where we began!
