## Meet your Neighbor Tom Oxford: Resident of Vermont Commons for 55 years!



Tom moved to his home on Driscoll in Vermont Commons in 1967. He was one of the original volunteers who helped start Vermont Commons Civic Association in the 1990s and continued to volunteer for many years. After he moved in, he discovered that next door to his new home, two years prior to moving in, the Ice Box Murders occurred. A book about the murders was written in 2003 – *The Ice Box Murders* by Hugh and Martha Gardenier (only available electronically). "At that time real estate salespeople did not have to make any disclosures, therefore, we did not know until after moving in that the icebox murder house was next door. It did not bother us. I even ended up mowing the property's lawn as a convenience for the attorney of that estate."

Tom is the rare native Houstonian and grew up near Moody Park. He attended Jefferson Davis High School as did his mother. Kenny Rogers and

Tom were in the same class. Kenny never came to the high school reunions, but always sent his best wishes. Tom says the most dramatic changes in the area are the multitude of townhouses and apartments, not to mention the increase in traffic. "It took a long time before I realized that Driscoll is the only street between Shepherd and Woodhead that goes completely through from West Gray to Westheimer." The restaurant that Tom misses most is Leo's Mexican Restaurant, which was on Shepherd. "And, of course, we followed them to Washington Avenue until they closed." From the time he graduated until he retired at 62, Tom was in the land title business beginning with Houston Title where his father worked. "I left that business in 2000. For the next 20 years I worked part-time at the River Oaks Bookstore until they closed in 2020. For the last 26 years I have worked weekends at Joshua's Native Plants in the Heights." Tom is very knowledgeable about plants and has a beautiful garden in his front yard that attracts butterflies, bees, and neighbors! He also bakes delicious bread for his lucky next door neighbors!



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
