

WHAT IS THE CITIZENS' PATROL?? ANOTHER TOOL TO PROTECT OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

Maybe you have wondered what the Citizen Patrol signs that you see in the neighborhood refer to. Citizen Patrol is a community-based volunteer program sponsored by the Houston Police Department. The goal of Citizens' Patrol is to provide an effective method of discouraging crime while promoting friendlier, safer neighborhoods.

VCCA's Involvement includes establishing a communication pathway between VCCA residents and the police department. Volunteers track and report patrol hours monthly to the coordinator. These reports are posted in the VCCA newsletter and reported to the Houston Police Department.

How do you know who is a Citizen Patrol volunteer? They are just like all the walkers and joggers in the neighborhood. They do not wear any particular clothing.
