The pioneers to the left gathered almost 30 years ago to hatch an idea that eventually became Vermont Commons Civic Association. The pioneers met to reminisce about the last 30 years of

Vermont Commons on March 6,2023 at the same spot they first met 30 years ago. The neighborhood was pretty shabby then, one pioneer said, but he thought it great potential. In 1992, Cay Dickson, the ring leader, put a flyer in neighborhood mailboxes. She had a dream and was very passionate about meeting her neighbors and creating a sense of community. The seven in the picture above and three others answered Cay's call. They participated because they wanted this area to be their forever homes. All seven have continued to live in Vermont Commons - John and Christine Focke in their 1933 home, John and Anna Doody in their 1933 home, Tom Oxford in his 1934 home and Margaret Lam in her 1984 townhouse. Cay Dickson moved into her 1938 house, built a townhouse on the property, and still lives in her townhouse. They all agreed that the primary reasons they attended that meeting 30 years ago were to meet neighbors and to figure out how to improve the neighborhood. Margaret said they began to work with City of Houston to determine how to protect the area. From those meetings a plan to create deed restrictions began. It was a tremendous amount of hard work, but eventually the deed restrictions were filed with the City. They planned for the future for all of us and stayed to enjoy the fruits of their labors. Thank you to our great pioneers!!!! They were right; it is a fabulous neighborhood to live in.

Montrose Blvd Redevelopment

(VCCA SENT A LETTER IN SUPPORT OF THIS PROJECT)

There is a proposed plan for \$55 million in improvements along a stretch of Montrose Boulevard where development is booming. The project involves making street, sidewalk, and drainage improvements along a 2-mile stretch of Montrose Boulevard from Allen Parkway to I-69. Lane and sidewalk configurations differ across three distinct sections of the project. The plans largely focus on widening sidewalks, improving safety, and making the road more accessible to all user types. The project is being taken on and funded by the Montrose Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone, which contracted with Gauge Engineering for the design work. At a meeting, attendees browsed posters with project details and spoke to representatives working on the project's design. They could also place notes on project maps with comments or suggestions. NMCA leadership and people who attended the January NMCA meeting offered additional suggestions for the TIRZ items for inclusion in the final project proposal including:

- Improved street and pedestrian sidewalk lighting
- Raised crosswalks that are adjacent to nearby school intersections
- Unique and distinct signage for Montrose Boulevard
- Placement of benches and bike racks
- Creation of a dedicated fund for the maintenance of Montrose Boulevard, its esplanades, and trees.

Plans call for work to begin later this year on Montrose Boulevard section that runs from Allen Parkway to West Dallas Street.
