PROJECT BACKGROUND

This project was recommended in the Walk+Bike Montrose plan, which identified these corridors to be developed into Neighborhood Safe Streets. A **Neighborhood Safe Street** is a corridor designed so that roadway users of all ages and abilities, no matter their mode of travel, will feel safe and comfortable traveling along that corridor

PROJECT OBJECTIVES


Convert Woodhead St. and Hawthorne St. corridors into Neighborhood Safe Streets and making the corridors more walkable and safer for all, recognizing the daily walk trips by parents and kids to Lanier Middle school

Improve Bicycle Safety & Mobility:

Mill & overlay existing deteriorated asphalt roadway, re-stripe the roadway, replace speed humps with speed cushions, and install curb extensions at intersections to develop a safe, low-stress shared roadway experience for both motorists and bicyclists.

Improve Pedestrian Facilities:

Promote a pedestrian-friendly environment by incorporating 6-FT wide, continuous, uninterrupted and safe sidewalks accompanied by City compliant curb ramps along the project corridors, within public right-of way.







City of Houston Matching Grant Program: A Win-Win Solution for VCCA

Vermont Commons Civic Association (VCCA) has put together a committee to research ideas on a community marker using the city of Houston Matching Grant Program to augment our funding. The COH grant program is designed to encourage community organizations and nonprofits to leverage their resources with city funding. VCCA is eligible to receive a matching grant, which could double the organization's funds for our community project.

Through discussions with residents, we have community support for installing some type of community marker that would:

- Increase our neighborhood visibility
- Make our neighborhood appear more organized and well-maintained
- Display our name and logo as a public acknowledgment of our pride and commitment to the area we call home

VCCA looks to maintain transparency and encourage collaboration for community partnership on this project. As a first step, we're seeking your involvement on what you think would be a good choice as a community marker! Examples of community markers:

- Street sign toppers (with the VCCA logo)
- Entry markers masonry installation, metal lamp post markers, etc (with VCCA logo)
- Designated garden area (with maintenance plan)
