SEPTEMBER'S HAPPY HOUR AND SPEAKER WERE A GREAT SUCCESS!



TRASH TALK!

Some residents seem unsure or even a little forgetful about when and how we place our trash and recycle cans out for pick up. Here are the City of Houston rules: City-provided containers must be placed at the curb <u>between 6 p.m. the day before and 7 a.m. on the scheduled collection day</u>. Place the container on the curb facing the street with the handle facing the house. Containers must be accessible and not blocked by obstacles, including parked cars, trees, mailboxes, fencing, etc. Leave at least a 3 foot space between garbage and recycling containers, which allows the truck to operate safely. Containers must be <u>removed</u> from the curb line and/or public view by 10:00 p.m. on the day of collection and stored in a secure location.
